COVID-19 policy for DCU Baking Society

- All public health measure will be adhered to over the course of this pandemic.
- These measures include hand hygiene, cough and sneeze etiquette and social distancing.
- These measures will be put in place when the society convenes on campus
- When we reconvene on campus, a log of attendees will be taken and their contact details. This is for contact tracing purposes only.
- A digital copy of these records must be kept. This will be in line with GDPR regulations. Every member will be told that a digital copy is kept of these details.
- For on campus events, members will be asked to sanitise their hands on entry and exit of the venue.
- If members are baking for other members, public health measures must be followed in their households. These measures include;
 - Using gloves for handling dough etc
 - Washing hands before and after baking
 - Sanitising any containers that will transport the bakes to the college
 - Wear a mask whilst baking
- Any containers used when on campus must be sanitised after use.
- Depending on numbers, each group will have to be split into pods of six,
 in accordance with the 'living with COVID-19' framework.

- All public health posters will have to be displayed when on campus.
 These posters include; public health poster with symptoms of COVID-19 and hand washing poster.
- When on campus, everyone will use their own plate and fork.
- One person will be designated for cutting bakes to prevent cross contamination of the knife.
- Should anyone present with symptoms of COVID-19, this person will be immediately isolated from the group in the designated isolation area of the college (I will speak with the university as to where this area is)
- In rare cases where injury occurs, the designated first aider will wear PPE to treat the injury.
- Everyone will have to wear a mask when not sampling the bakes.
- I will work with other society's COVID- 19 officers to find the best protocols.
- Everyone will have their temperature checked on arrival.
- Do not attend any of our events if you have symptoms of COVID-19.
- The room we use will have to be sanitised after use.

In these unprecedented times, we must follow the above guidelines. We can have fun in this society, but we must do it safely to protect our loved ones and everyone around us.
